- ii. The Pachner Company LLC/Pachner Group (including Marcus Pachner).

1. I am over the age of eighteen years and have personal knowledge of the facts in this Affidavit. I am submitting this Affidavit to provide necessary facts for the Court to take judicial notice concerning publicly available data from a local government agency's website reporting campaign contributions to Denver City Council members, in order to support my clients' opening brief.


